Deep water at the dam end of the pond and there may be water and soft sediment either side of the walkways. Ensure mobile phone is charged and keep in your fishing bag or waterproof pouch. 2	Junior Members	Health Safety Security Environment	Junior members (Ages 7-15 inclusive) are likely to be less experienced anglers and also less experienced in understanding hazards and the associated risks when on GAC waters.	5	4	20	No Juniors under 12 years of age are allowed at St-y-Nyll. No unaccompanied Juniors aged 12 and over are allowed at St-y-Nyll. 3	Nuisance	Environment	Individual ban for ignoring 07:00 hrs rule. Loss of water due to persistent offenders ignoring 07:00 rule.	5	2	10	Do not enter the site before 07:00 hrs. 4	Fish Diseases	Environment	Disease or death of fish and other aquatic species	5	2	10	There is no dip tank at St-y-Nyll. so ensure your nets and mats are rinsed in tap water when you return home removing all debris and dry in the open air Wash waders and any other equipment such as your rake that has been in contact with the waterbody in tap water removing all debris and dry in the open air.	5	1	5	Anglers & Bailiffs
5	Uneven or marshy ground conditions.	Health Safety	Slips, trips and falls	2	5	10	Only use the established tracks and raised walkways to access lake.	2	2	4	Anglers & Bailiffs
